

THE 2 MEDALS IN THE TRAP MIXED TEAM ARE AN HAPPY ENDING FOR THE BERETTA TEAM ADVENTURE IN TOKYO

Beretta athletes return home with 9 medals after Fatima Galvez's gold for Spain and Alessandra Perilli's silver for San Marino

Tokyo, 31st July 2021 - The Sport Shooting Olympics and the Beretta Team's adventure in Tokyo 2020 end today with the Trap Mixed Team finals.

After the exciting gold of Czech Jiří Lipták in the Trap men and the beautiful bronze of San Marino's Alessandra Perilli in the Trap Women, 2 more medals are added to the Beretta palmarès with the victory of Fatima Galvez's Spanish Team achieving gold with 148/150 (+1), and the Silver of San Marino, providing a second acknowledgment to Alessandra Perilli with the result of 148/150 (+0).

The experience of the Beretta Team in these Olympic Games therefore comes to an end with a total of 9 medals (3 golds, 3 silvers and 3 bronzes).

10 years after its launch, the DTII platform is reconfirmed as the first choice of champions and a strong ally of the winners at the Olympics.

Here a brief recap of the results achieved by the Beretta athletes in Tokyo 2020:

- Silver Trap Mixed Team Alessandra Perilli (SMR) with DTII
- Bronze Skeet Men Abdullah Al-Rashidi (KWT) with ASE90
- Bronze Skeet Women Wei Meng (CHN) with DTII
- Bronze Trap Women Alessandra Perilli (SMR) with DTII

Fatima Galvez and Alessandra Perilli gifted us with great emotions. They approached this competition with a complete Beretta branded equipment: not only their DT11 shotguns but also the vests of their respective National Teams and the Shooting Data platform. Too bad for the Italian Team we are emotionally connected with for obvious reasons, but with all our support I am sure we can start again and look to Paris with confidence. Long live the Beretta Team!"

The President Franco Gussalli Beretta finally commented: "Two more precious medals! I am happy for the prestigious overall result, the second best ever. With 3 Golds, 3 Silvers and 3 Bronzes we take home with us another significant Olympic experience. The DTII is again confirmed as an extremely performing shotgun in every discipline. Congratulations to our athletes, a big thanks for the sacrifices they make every day and for their ability to convey our beautiful sport all over the world. Finally, thanks also to all the collaborators who work at Beretta for the important Olympic project."

A tribute and thanks also goes to all the Beretta athletes who arrived to these Olympics from all over the world and to the finalists, who lost the chance to win a medal but have proven extraordinary results promising a bright future in international competitions: Eetu Kallioinen, 23-year-old Finn in fourth place for the Skeet Men; Jorge Martin Orozco Diaz from Mexico, just 21 years old and just one step away from the Trap Men podium, the French Eric Delaunay and the Italian Tammaro Cassandro (respectively fifth and sixth place in the Skeet Men), both achieving



world record for the best qualifying result with 124/125; young 23-year-old Yu Haicheng, Chinese revelation who won a fifth place in Trap Men; Laetisha Scanlan and Penny Smith from Australia (respectively fourth and sixth in Trap Women) and Silvana Stanco, who comes home with the best result for the Italian team scoring a fifth place in the Trap Women.
